Methods Help others: follow themes

Preparation Time

Location Indoors

You will need:

- Cups
- String
- Braille key
- Braille samples
- · Sign language pictures

Activity Instructions

Braille:

- 1. If possible obtain leaflets or books that have been produced using Braille.
- 2. Allow Beaver Scouts time to look and feel the Braille.
- 3. Hand out sheets with the Braille alphabet printed on it. Ask the Beaver Scouts to write their name in Braille. Some may need help with this.

String and cup (can) phone

- 1. Either make the phones before the meeting or let the Beaver Scouts make them.
- 2. Punch a small hole in the bottom of the cup or can, thread string into the holes and tie a knot so it doesn't fall out.
- 3. Pair the Beaver Scouts up and give each pair a cup/can phone and let them use them. Explain to the Beaver Scouts that they will work better when the string is pulled tight.

Sign Language

Many young people learn the alphabet in sigh language at school so they may already be able to sign their name. If they can ask them to sign their name to you. If not start teaching them the alphabet and their names in sign language. If you have a big colony, divide them into smaller groups to learn.
